Simplified Access Wording

Access at Glyndyfrdwy at the Coed Y Glyn Log Cabins site

20th October to 31st March

All days of the week available if the water level is **at least 3ft** on the Coed Y Glyn gauge at 8:00am;

Launching between 10:00am (9:30am for Commercial Operators) and 1:00pm;

Water to be vacated by 3:00pm;

1st April to 30th August

Wednesdays and Saturdays only – no water level restriction;

Launching between 10:00am (9:30am for Commercial Operators) and 1:00pm;

Water to be vacated by 3:00pm.

31st August to 19th October

Padding only permitted when the water level is **at least 3ft** on the gauge at 8:00am;

Launching between 10:00am (9:30am for Commercial Operators) and 1:00pm;

Water to be vacated by 3:00pm.

Strictly no rafts allowed

Access at Horseshoe Falls using the Llantysilio Car Park

Unrestricted access from below the Horseshoe Falls (canal side), 365 days per year;

Launching between 10:00am (9:30am for Commercial Operators) and 1:00pm;

Water to be vacated by 3:00pm.

Note that use of the Chainbridge Hotel upper car park is by prior arrangement and by express permission of the hotel (reception@chainbridgehotel.com). There is no parking or unloading allowed at the Chainbridge Hotel main car park.

Egress Points

Horseshoe Falls - river left (canal side)

Mile End Mill – river right (canoe centre side)

Llangollen Town Wier – 200 yards downstream of bridge, river left
(adjacent steps to Ponsonby Arms)

Ty Mawr Country Park - 6 miles downstream of bridge, river left

About Welsh Dee Partnership

In early 2012 the Welsh Dee Partnership was established to try and resolve issues on the river around the impact of increased canoeing activity on angling interests on the River Dee. The three angling clubs of Corwen and District, The Midland Fly Fishers and Llangollen Maelor brought together local commercial canoeing interests through the Welsh Dee Commercial Operators Group to agree access arrangements.

Extensive meetings have been held with Welsh Dee Commercial Operators Group, Natural Resources Wales, Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty, Denbighshire County Council and angling clubs. This resulted in shared access arrangements being agreed in August 2012 for a stretch of the river from the Horseshoe Falls to Llangollen town weir 365 days of the year. In addition a high water level was set to allow access when the river is above a set height making it unsuitable for fishing.
